What is the Cragg Vale Carbon Neutral (CVCN) Group – I hear you ask....... The CVCN Group is a group of Cragg residents who are concerned about climate change and are keen to do something locally to address this global issue. The CVCN first started meeting in November 2008 and currently has 12 members. What is the aim of the CVCN?



The long term aim of the CVCN group is to make the valley of Cragg Vale carbon neutral. We hope to achieve this through a mixture of supporting people in the valley in taking individual actions to reduce their emissions and community-based efforts to develop renewable energy & carbon sinks.

The Cragg Vale Carbon Neutral Group meets every month (usually the 1st or 2nd Monday of each month). The next meeting will be held on Monday 6th April in the back room of the Robin Hood Inn at 8pm.


