[b] Up to 11 Other Committee Members elected from the membership.

The Committee shall meet, adjourn and otherwise regulate its business as it may decide but shall meet no less than six times each year. Unless the Committee decides otherwise, no less than three members of the Committee who must be Officers of the Committee shall be a quorum. Proposed Amendment

Article 31 Regulation of Business and Quorum shall be amended to delete 'but shall meet no less than six times a year' and replace with 'but shall meet no less than four times a year'

(3) Special Resolution 2b (re Article 31)

Article 31 Regulation of Business and Quorum shall be amended to delete 'no less than three members who must be Officers' and replace with 'no less than four members of the Committee of whom no less than two must be Officers'

(3) Special Resolution 2b (re Article 31)

Current Article 35 Delegation of Powers

The Committee may delegate any of its powers to sub-committees consisting of any persons that the Committee shall think suitable. The Committee may make, amend and revoke regulations for the purpose of defining the membership, functions and powers of any sub-committee. which shall report its acts and proceedings to and conform to any regulations imposed by the Committee

Proposed Amendment

Article 35 Delegation of Powers shall be amended add, after 'any persons that the Committee shall think suitable' the following words: "but shall include no less than one Committee Member"

> We're proposing to have guarterly Committee meetings, to make it easier for people to get to the meetings. All Committee members are protected from financial liability through our status as a 'Company Limited by Guarantee'

Special Resolutions For The Cragg Vale Community Association Annual General Meeting

The Committee of Cragg Vale Community Ltd are proposing some amendments to

the CVCA Articles (constitution) to help us to run more effectively. The present Committee Members believe it will be more efficient to:

- have a smaller Committee of 9, with co-options from time to time if any additional expertise is needed
- to reduce the number of Committee Meetings required each year to a minimum of 4, not 6 (This doesn't prevent the Committee holding additional meetings if necessary but should help prevent the problem of holding a meeting for the sake of meeting!)

Cragg Vale Community Association acts as an 'umbrella organisation for several groups that we have set up as subcommittees. 'We want to make sure that these groups will continue to have twoway links with the main Committee and will comply with any rules for CVCA. We are therefore also proposing an amendment to:

- require the membership of any Sub Committee to include at least one Committee Member



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
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One of the many businesses in Cragg Vale supporting the Community Association and our activities is 'Craggs Cakes Ltd'. Any of you who were lucky enough to sample some of the 'Spaw Sunday' cake or who shared a piece of the 'Tour de Cragg' treasure hunt prize cake will know just how delicious these cakes are!

Craggs Cakes Ltd, set up in 2008, is owned and run by Josie Pemberton-Clarke and her husband. Marianne Hood, company secretary for CVCA went to talk to Josie to find out a bit more about the business and why she chose Cragg Vale.

Josie said that, like her Mum, she had always baked. When her Mum went to cake decorating classes. she went with her and got hooked, but "there are only so many cakes you can bake and eat vourself"! Friends were always asking Josie to make cakes for them so in 2007 she went on a course 'How to set up your own business' at the Elsie Whitley Centre in Halifax. Josie explained that there is a lot do and learn in setting up your own business, but "if it is something you believe in and you have real passion, that's what's important"

Josie and her husband, who prefers doing baking to going to Farmer's Markets, chose Cragg Vale because "it is a fantastic location, it's quiet, near to where we live and we've been able to get it set up exactly as we wanted!" They now employ another lady to help with the baking as Josie has to 'juggle' the time she spends baking and decorating cakes with delivering to shops, restaurants, cafes, delicatessens and markets from Howarth to Huddersfield! This is in addition to the special food events, festivals and Farmers' Markets - and Josie will be at the Farmers' Market in Hebden Bridge every Sunday from now until Christmas!

In response to questions about changes since they first set up, Josie said she hadn't expected to have stalls at Farmers' markets but now there is much more interest in and demand for local produce. She enjoys talking to people and getting feedback and this helps her 'tweak' what they produce. For example, they now make a lot of 'powerbars' without nuts and they discovered you can't sell Parkin in Lancashire, they just don't know what it is!

Baking takes place seven days a week and is mostly to order except for cakes such as fruit cakes which have a longer shelflife. Their range includes gluten-free, yegan (in response to requests from customers), 'special' cakes for weddings and birthdays, and specific cakes for specific customers. Josie

> said which cakes are most popular seems to depend on the area: in Cragg Vale and Hebden Bridge lemon drizzle is very popular and so is carrot cake. Ginger cake sells well as does Raspberry, Blueberry and Lime. One slightly strange change in popularity, or lack of it, is Cherry Madeira cake. They used to make a lot but demand has fallen and as this cake does not have a long shelf life they have dropped it from their range. Josie said they only use the best quality ingredients and they keep a keen eye on trying to source things as locally as possible.

I asked Josie if they have any plans for the visit of the Tour de France and (apart from hiding in a dark room with a towel around her head!) she said they are hoping to join up with Little Valley Brewery and maybe a couple of other Cragg Businesses to produce 'hamper bags' for people watching the event. However, the focus at the moment is Christmas and the Farmers' Markets – and they have just produced, for the first time, a special ginger biscuit 'Christmas Tree'!
