THE LONGEST HILL ON THE LONGEST DAY

Two weeks before Le Tour sweeps up Cragg Vale, local cyclists are planning to set a new record: the number of climbs of the hill that can be accumulated in 24 hours. Each 27 ascents is equivalent to climbing Everest!

Starting at 6pm on Friday 20th June and ending at 6pm on Saturday 21st June, "The Longest Hill on the Longest Day" will see cyclists riding in various combinations to ensure there is at least one rider on the hill at any time. They will count the climbs by collecting tokens (lego bricks!) at the top and posting the tally in a live running chalkboard format on the front of the Robin Hood Inn.

Based at the Robin Hood, facilities for keeping everyone going will be available for the full 24 hours. It promises to be another great carnival atmosphere. THE LONGEST CHOIR

Members of the Association of British Choral Directors (abcd) conduct community choirs all over the country as interest in community choirs continues to grow. Yorkshire and East Lancashire choirs are promoting music in towns up and down the upper Calder Valley during the summer months with their choir leaders and directors. How would it be if they came together for a new type of event to celebrate Le Grand Départ of the Tour de France? At an abcd conducting event, the idea of the longest choir along the longest hill for the Tour de France took off in a big way. Currently over two hundred people have signed up to sing in Cragg Vale on June 21st!

At 11am on Saturday 21st June, led by Olwyn Pearce, conductor of 'Secret Singers Todmorden', choirs will gather in Cragg Vale Park. The songs are available to learn before the day: abcd.yorkshire@outlook.com. Olwyn has wide experience of helping people find their voice and have fun singing. This will be an 'open access' event with no auditions or previous experience required. After a short practice the singers will cross the road at Twist Clough at around 11.30am to stand on the pavement. As the line gets into position, hopefully as far up as Cragg School (all local residents are invited to join in), singing leaders will start the songs going up the line in groups of six until the whole line is singing! The singing leaders will then bring the songs back down the line.

When the singing has finished, everyone is encouraged to go and enjoy the Ryburn 3 Step music and dance event at 2pm at the Hinchliffe Arms.

Spring has been lovely in the reserve this year. The bluebells were beautiful, the cuckoo was calling loudly, and we had 11 cows munching contentedly in the meadows. They were with us for almost 6 weeks and have grazed off the long grass and thatch that had built up. Some flowers should manage to bloom albeit a little late and then the cows will return to clear this year's growth before the autumn fungi. 9 people joined the rota- in pairs or as individual stock checkers- and we all enjoyed this new role.

Fencing the outer boundaries of the reserve was another big job completed this quarter. It began on the day of the Piano Porte, with the

help of a helicopter which you may have seen flying back and forth to lift all the stakes and wire mesh up to the top of the moor. The lower fencing around Parrock Clough was also finished, so the reserve is now stock proof from animals on the commons.

NEW 'STAGE WINNER' BEER LAUNCHED BY LITTLE VALLEY BREWER'

NEW 'STAGE WINNER' BEER LAUNCHED BY LITTLE VALLEY BREWERY IN CELEBRATION OF BRITISH CYCLING PIONEER, BRIAN ROBINSON

Little Valley Brewery based in here Cragg Vale on England's longest continuous gradient and home to Stage 2 of Le Tour de France on 6th July, has launched a brand new beer in celebration of Brian Robinson, pioneer of British cycling and Yorkshire cycling hero.

At the launch at Brasserie Blanc in Leeds, one of the outlets where the beer will be stocked, the name of the beer was unveiled as 'Stage Winner' by master brewer and co-founder of Little Valley Brewery, Wim van der Spek. At the event, guest of honour Brian, and his wife Audrey, enjoyed a pint of the new beer along with members of the media and the beer and cycling community in Yorkshire.

Wim and co-owner, Sue Cooper, both keen cyclists, decided to brew this special beer to put the spotlight on Brian's great cycling achievements; from being the first Briton to complete the Tour de France in 1955, to the first to win a stage in 1958. The following year, Brian convincingly won a mountain stage of the Tour de France between Annecy to Chalon-sur-Saône, and in 1961 he was the overall winner of Le Dauphiné Libéré, an eight stage cycling race through this mountainous region in France.

The 'Stage Winner' name and the beer's red polka dot label and pump clip reflecting Brian's international road racing success and triumph in the mountains, and his love of the hills of Yorkshire.

Developed by Wim, 'Stage Winner', 3.5% ABV is both a cask and bottle-conditioned beer which has been brewed to create a light and refreshing taste; ideal for enjoying after a cycle ride or while watching the Tour de France as it races through Yorkshire!

It is a moderately hopped ale with a delicate level of bitterness. As with all Little Valley beers it is made from 100% organic agricultural ingredients, contains no additives, pesticides, or GM crops, and is certified by the Soil Association, endorsed by CAMRA, and approved by the Vegan Society.

"It is a real pleasure to be here today to celebrate the launch of Little Valley's 'Stage Winner' beer and be one of the first people to enjoy a pint of this refreshing ale", said Brian at the event. "Sue and Wim are as passionate about cycling as they are about their beer so it is no surprise that in the year the Tour de France comes past their brewery they have created a beer to celebrate cycling success. In July I'm sure we'll all be toasting the success of the Tour in Yorkshire with a pint of two of 'Stage Winner!"

"Brian has always been a hero of ours," added Wim. "From the first time Sue and I met him we were truly inspired by his cycling achievements, and the fact that he is still such an active ambassador for the sport today. In this special year, when the eyes of cycling fans around the world will be focused on Yorkshire, it seemed fitting to put the spotlight on Brian's achievements with the launch of our new beer. We are delighted that Brian has given 'Stage Winner' his seal of approval!
