We did it! At 12,115m 83cm (39,750ft 1in), Cragg Vale holds the current Bunting World Record. The record was achieved on the 15th June 2014 at Craggs Country Business Park where the bunting had to be

hung in one continuous piece and verified by independent adjudicators! It was then taken down and loaded onto large wooden drums before being hung the length of Cragg Vale in time for the Tour de France passing through the village. Special thanks goes to Craggs Energy for all their help, support, and use of their premises

Over 200 people contributed lengths of bunting to get the record, with the largest donation from Mrs Doris Hirst of a mile! A tremendous sight, it caused quite a stir, with people visiting the valley just to see it and perhaps spot their piece. The stretch across the moor looked spectacular and was the subject of many photographs on Facebook. And having put it all up, it then

had to come down, most of it on one of the wettest days in recent

memory! Bunting collected was sold off at the Cragg Vale Country Fair, raising over £700 to be go to the Calder Valley Search and Rescue Team.

The bunting was a great success – bringing the community together, making the valley stand out as part of the Tour de France, attracting media coverage of the valley and

bringing much-needed funds to a local cause. A huge thank you and well done goes to all those who took part.

Forest Schools provide a unique and fun learning experience.

Originally developed in Scandinavia to teach about the environment and the world around us, they provide stimulating, memorable and exciting experiences for children. Forest Schools have been recognised for helping children understand the importance of being healthy, staying safe, enjoying activities and making a positive contribution.

Forest School has been a great success at The Ark Nursery. Sessions take place in a woodland area which is in close proximity to the nursery and the Pre-school children can't wait for Mondays and Fridays to come round. They enjoy the wild open space, playing in the river, climbing trees, hiding in the willow den and best of all - playing in the mud! The children gain first-hand experience of learning about the seasons, wild life, plants and also have the opportunity to use a variety of different tools such as a bow saw and secateurs. Cooking outdoors is also great fun and very necessary after an hour or two

playing outside! The children have made a variety of delights on the open fire: garlic bread using hand-picked garlic from Mr McGregor's garden, scones, pancakes, roasted apples and even a chocolate cake baked inside an orange!. The Pre-school children have even had lunch at Forest School - sausages, jacket potatoes and gravy made in the Kelly kettle!

BROADHEAD CLOUGH — SEPTEMBER UPDATE

This summer has been a welcome return to normal after the dreadful wet one of 2012 and the really cold spring in 2013. During the summer workdays we've mainly concentrated on bracken control in the top mire and in the grasslands to stop its spread and encourage the bilberry, heather and grassland flowers. Without the flowers and fruit for insects and small rodents there is no food chain to support the birds and larger mammals. The Wildlife Trusts management of habitat helps other wildlife charities achieve their aims. Here is one good example this year.

Yorkshire Barn Owls –2013 was a disaster - vole populations collapsed and there were many reports of dead owls and chicks. This year the Trust campaigned to restore grasslands used by barn owls for hunting and purchase new nestboxes. So far, thirty are being put up on YWT reserves and another twenty nestboxes are on order. Some will be passed to the Barn Owl Conservation Network for private landowners. There is one on land

near our reserve... will it attract them?

If you spot a barn owl anywhere in Yorkshire log the sighting at

www.barnowls.ywt.org.uk

This summer I repeated the breeding bird survey in Broadhead. The series of 6 visits resolves itself into a pattern so each sighting of a familiar blue tit or a blackbird reveals their territory as the summer wears on. We still had a breeding pair of jays and a family of long tailed tits: but both had moved to different sites from last year. I heard woodpeckers again, (although this year their nest wasn't visible), but no tawny owl hoots even though they'd been there all winter. There was a literal "flying visit" from a pair of buzzards who didn't stay. Things change but overall it shows how our management is helping the bird population.

The next workday is Friday September 12th and the cows will be back during September



to graze off the grass before the fungi begin to spore. Other autumn dates will be posted on the web site
