Broadhead **Clough February** 2017 update

The sun shone today! It's been dull and grey for so long that I really noticed the bright rays: strong enough to cast shadows. During the winter we have had help to maintain the path with CROWS (Community Rights of Way) putting in steps and some drainage at the worst points. We've also spent several hours each workday to keep on top of broken /fallen trees. Often a large branch has partly torn away and is a hazard for people, and if left, could cause further damage to the tree. The sound of the chain saw always jars, but the log piles created give good habitat for insects and the new clearings offer opportunities for flowers or moss to re-

One year after the floods the clearing up operation is also giving other unexpected benefits. Dredging the Calder has removed huge amounts of Himalayan Balsam from the river system. Though pretty in small patches, this notorious "non- native invasive species" was getting out of control. It starves native plants of space, light, nutrients and pollinators so they no longer grow and can lead to erosion of the river bank. The job was carefully done by the Environment Agency but how many seeds have already been spread? Just a few on Brearley fields could mean reinfection. Luckily it's not yet appeared in the nature reserve – but even so, I've just been sent information about "Biosecurity" practice to try and avoid accidental spread from one place to another. If you have problems with it nearby, or you are a recreational water user there's a website training course to "Check, Clean and Dry" available at

www.nonnativespecies.org/index.cfm? sectionid=123

Since 2014 DEFRA have been testing a fungus "Himalayan balsam rust" to see if it is a safe natural control. A trial release was held in West Yorkshire, involving the Environment Agency, Yorkshire Water, Wakefield Council, Calder and Colne Rivers Trust monitoring the results. It's looking positive, so perhaps the balsam's days are numbered and once again, its bright splash of colour becomes a rare treat rather than seen as a nuisance.

In the Spring workdays are planned on the first Friday of the month: March 3rd, April 6th, May 5th, and June 2nd. We meet at 10a.m. by the reserve signboard.



Erringden Deer Park

In Medieval, times Broadhead Clough above Erringden Moor was home to hundreds of deer. 'Erringden Deer Park' was established around 1331 by descendents of Sir William de Warenne, 1st Earl of Surrey, who, having fought with William the Conquerer at the Battle of Hastings in 1066, was rewarded for his services with nine "berewicks" (remote estates), including the "Forest of Sowerbyshire" in the Manor of Wakefield.



A deer park was probably the ultimate Medieval status symbol, and Erringden was known to be one of the largest in the country, covering 3000 acres of the hillside above Hebden Bridge. The deer belonged to the Lord of the Manor and were kept for breeding, mainly for the pleasure of the hunt. Venison could not be bought or sold locally and the park was ditched and paled around its entire perimeter to keep the deer in and intruders out.

Unsurprisingly the park was not always popular with the people struggling to make a living from the land. "Parkbreakers" would deliberately trespass in order to thumb a nose at authority; but woe betide anyone caught as penalties for trespass or poaching were severe!

Lying within the deer park boundary to the east of Erringden Moor, is possibly one of the oldest settlements in Erringden - Bell House, thought to exist as far back as the 1300s. It is said a bell was used to call the deer together for feeding and this gave the name to Bell House. (Bell House is now more famed as the home to the leader of the notorious 'Cragg Vale Coiners' - but that's another story...)

In 1451 Richard, Duke of York, had the Deer Park "dispaled" and broken up to form farmsteads. However nearly six hundred years later, if you know what to look for, it is still possible to see clear signs of the boundary features that formed the deerpark such as the ditches and banks, and some of the S marked boundary stones.

Branwell Bronte's 200th Anniversary
