

# SUPERFAST BROADBAND IN CRAGG VALE

18 months ago, Craggs Country Business Park committed to building a Wireless Network Bridge from their Head Office down into Cragg Vale

The aim was to provide Super Fast internet services to the frustrated residents of the Valley.

Building the network was a challenge with both the weather and geography of the valley causing a few headaches, but customers started being connected just over a year ago.

Since launch, there have been more than 20 connections to homes with speeds of between 17 and 30MB and the network was recently upgraded to allow faster

speeds in the future. The BT Leased Line connection was upgraded from 50Mb to 100Mb in 2016 and again to a lightning 200Mb this month, allowing the network to be shared across a greater number of connections and still increase both performance and stability.

After a pause in connections over the winter, new additions from the waiting list will be bought online now that the weather is better and the backbone of the network has been upgraded.



## **News from the Ark**

At The Ark we pride ourselves on promoting a healthy balanced diet and a healthy lifestyle. The children have access to an extensive outdoor area where they can run, play, and explore in a safe environment. The pre-school children also access our Forest School site where they can explore the wooded area, climbing and splashing in the stream and toasting homemade crumpets around the fire pit.



A healthy balanced diet can be hard to maintain especially if you have a child who is challenging with their food choices. We also promote "eat a rainbow" of fruit and vegetables. The cook chooses a colour of the rainbow and buys fruit and vegetables in season the same colour for the children to try at snack time. We have a consistent approach to teaching the children about the different colours and textures of the food and the importance of a balanced diet. This is done in a fun environment with the encouragement of the staff and the other children in the group trying the fruit and vegetables. We encourage the children to talk about which fruit and vegetables they like the best,

although trying lemons usually produces some very funny faces!

Preschool have started the funky foods programme where they encourage a balanced diet using an "eatwell" plate showing the correct portion sizes to ensure a balanced diet. The programme teaches the children through different activities, the importance of eating 5 portions of fruit and vegetables a day. There are exciting activities around healthy lifestyles and exercise and what our body needs to grow and develop. #### Broadhead Clough June 2017 update

Around 1260 a song was written describing this time of year perfectly. It starts in today's spelling with "Summer is a'coming in: loudly sings Cuckoo!" We are so lucky to have one returning again this year to the reserve -one of only 2 YWT sites to have cuckoos of the 36 surveyed in 2016. In England our summer highlights are as varied as our countryside and here in Cragg we have grasslands, rocky "cliffs", moors, woods and rivers - the only one missing is the sea. Whilst we can see all these landscapes through our window, windscreen or on-line there is something about being immersed in the sound, the smell and the textures of nature which sight alone just doesn't give. Once again throughout June the Wildlife Trusts are running their 30 Days Wild project. This year they are focussing on how connecting with nature can help human wellbeing as much as how our help can support nature.

A report they commissioned from Essex University has found that wildlife-rich environments don't just keep you physically healthy. They also reduce stress, improve mood and reduce social isolation. It proposes 5 evidence- based "Ways to Wellbeing".

## News from Cragg Vale J&I School

**Top Performing Schools** 

In 2016, Calder High School and Cragg Vale J&I School were the top performing Primary and Secondary schools in Calderdale and this academic year have both achieved 'Good' OFSTED ratings. From September 2017, they will join together as an all-through school to provide high quality education from 4-18 years and exciting new opportunities for pupils in both phases. Cragg Vale School will become Calder Primary School, and the pupils and staff will move together to their own Primary building on the Calder High site when it is ready for them to do so. It is extremely important to the school to maintain its ethos and values and its connections with Cragg Vale village. The school will continue to have the catchment area of Cragg Vale and will work hard to maintain the links with the church and local events.

### Defibrillator In Cragg Vale

As part of its commitment to the health and wellbeing of staff, customers and local residents, Craggs Country Business Park recently invested in an Automated External Defibrillator (AED).

It is installed outside the front door of Craggies Farm Shop. The unit is kept safe inside a cabinet, but full instructions for access are on the door, and when open, the machine talks the user through exact instructions for use, so it is safe for everyone involved!

It is to be hoped that the unit is never needed, but just in case it is registered with the local emergency services for their use, but also as a Community Public Access Defibrillator Site (cPAD) so it's available for any member of the general public who needs it.

In the UK there are over 30,000 "out of hospital" cardiac arrests each year, and the chances of survival if an AED is used within 3-5 minutes rises from 6% to 74%, a good reason to have at least one in Cragg Vale.

## Cragg Climb update



## **Cragg Vale Inn**



The new industrial Cragg Vale grew around a particularly important and busy pack horse route. It came over the hilltops from Sowerby, dropped into the valley bottom to cross Marshaw Bridge (mentioned in records as early as 1655), followed the Withens stream up onto the moors and so to Burnley, Clitheroe and the rest of Lancashire. This early bridge, built with 2 arches and quite low to the water unfortunately washed away in 1891.

The present Marshaw Bridge, built the following year, was a single, higher span, to avoid a repeat of the calamity. Anyone travelling this challenging route between Yorkshire and Lancashire would no doubt be relieved to reach the Cragg Vale Inn for refreshment. Built between 1700 and 1730, in the heart of the industrial scene, this inn was witness to much history. It was much smaller than the building which replaced it in 1840 demolished, but not "without trace", as the 17th century cellar remains unchanged, still in use today. The Cragg Vale Inn was possibly too close for comfort to the church, in the eyes of the locals - vicars of the time had a certain authority over the public houses, especially this one, as they had to sign the licence. Public houses were open all day, but the vicar had the right (and Rev Crowther often used it!) to turn everyone out and send them to the church when they were about to preach!

Around 1900 the portico was added – possibly paid for by Helen Hinchliffe, the last of the dynasty, after her father's death in 1900 - and the name changed to The Hinchliffe Arms, in acknowledgement of Cragg Vale's most prominent family.





## Talent at Top Land

Some amazingly talented people have moved into the Top Land Business Park, joining an ever increasing list of exciting businesses choosing Cragg Vale as their base. The new ones include Hebden Radio, Sand In Your Eye, and HebTroCo.

#### Sand In Your Eye

Sand In Your Eye, a sculpture and land art company, moved to Top Land in February this year. Established by Jamie Wardley in 2003, the creative team includes Claire Jamieson and Tom Bolland and they make sculptures from sand, ice and, most recently, pumpkins. They've worked with a wide range of charities, local authorities, PR and advertising agencies, music festivals and television and media broadcasters. You might have seen Claire making a sand drawing on BBC's SpringWatch from the Pembrokeshire Coast. Sand sculptures have been made for Desert Island Discs, to commemorate the Battle of the Somme, and to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday – a sand sculpture of



Buckingham Palace! However, they don't only sculpt sand, some people might remember the ice sculpture post box at the Christmas event in Mytholmroyd!

Before moving here in February 2017, they were based in an industrial yard in Bradford, Jamie says "We needed more space and somewhere we could invite the public to visit, hold workshops and run training sessions. It is so beautiful here in Cragg Vale, it looks like a country retreat, it's like going on holiday not going to work!" Claire, Jamie's partner, said "We have a little girl, Florence, and want to work locally and regionally as well as at a national level. It is ideal here."

The interior of the building at Top Land has been transformed with beach huts painted on one wall as a back drop for the huge sand pit where people of all ages can try their hand at creating sand sculptures. A lid on the sand pit transforms it into a stage and the building also houses a purpose-built freezer studio for the ice carving sessions.

The Sand In Your eye studio is now open, offering sand sculpture, ice sculpture and pumpkin carving workshops and training sessions. For more information visit www.sandinyoureye.co.uk



#### Hebden Radio

Hebden Radio was just moving in to its new premises in Dean Hey Business Park when I went to meet Tim Foulds, their Community Relations Co-ordinator.

They have 5,000 listeners and have been going for almost a year. The focus is on Calder Valley events, music and, of course, our weather!

In July they will go live on 87.7 FM and hope to be broadcasting 24 hours a day, every day. Tim said they had chosen to move to Cragg Vale because "it is such a beautiful part of the country, so calming, with wonderful views" Hebden Radio wanted a disabled-friendly site with space for live broadcasts and bands.

As well as inviting people and bands to the studio, Hebden Radio wants to be able to cover outside events and to promote the Arts and the many festivals held in the Calder Valley. They should find plenty going on here in Cragg Vale as well as in Mytholmroyd and Hebden Bridge!



Hebden Bridge was known as 'Trouser Town' in its industrial heyday and once produced 20,000 pairs of trousers a week. Brant and Ed, who run HebTroCo, said they would like the tradition of manufacturing to continue. They say they had a "crazy idea in the pub in December 2015" to start a trouser brand in Hebden Bridge. That day in the pub they heard all that was left was just one factory on the brink of closure. "At the time, we didn't know much about trousers, but we had been wearing them all our lives, which had to count for something! With the help and skill of the factory and other amazing local people, we were able to do it".



In their first six months they managed to sell over 1,000 pairs of their moleskin and needlecord trousers and say they will "make you the best pair of trousers you've ever had".

They aim to produce quality garments, made to last, by skilled people. Their trousers are guaranteed for life for manufacturing details. Brant suggested that maybe Mytholmroyd could become to be known as 'Courduroyd'!


