



Fifty a day to beat the Balsam

The Himalayan Balsam has featured in our newsletter on many previous occasions but we don't apologise for covering it again. It's a nonnative invasive species. As a profuse annual it dies back in winter to leave large clear areas more prone to soil erosion and flooding as well as swamping out our native plant species in woods, cloughs and riversides.





We're starting early this year with a new early, easy strategy to help clear large areas – try pulling up 50 a day while the plants are still small and before flowers or seeds begin to form. Every day you're out walking with the family or on the daily dog walk, pull up 50 a day! Please don't leave them on footpaths but pile them amongst the undergrowth. New Committee Members




At our AGM on 10th January we were very pleased to gain three new Committee: Vivien Aspey, Jane Frechette, and Sylvia Maudsley.

HOO HOLE THE WESLEY CONNECTION

The Christian preacher John Wesley visited Cragg Vale in 1770. He is credited, along with his brother Charles, with founding the Methodist movement. The Wesleys were natural organisers and approached everything diligently, especially religion. At Oxford University they participated in a Christian club in such an orderly way that critics called them 'methodists'.



John took to open-air preaching, having realised that open-air services were a successful way of reaching men and women who would not enter most churches, or where there were no churches. He kept detailed journals of all his travels, and he logged more than 4,000 miles a year – mostly on foot! During his lifetime he preached about 40,000 sermons.

John arrived in Cragg Vale on 28th June 1770 – his 67th birthday. He stopped to preach at Hoo Hole Farm



under a large tree which thrived as an emblem of the occasion for over two more centuries, until, sadly, it became diseased and had to be cut down. He wrote in his journal:

"It was a lovely valley encompassed by high mountains. I stood on smooth grass before the house, which stands on a gently rising ground, and all the people on the slope before me. It was a glorious opportunity."

You can picture them crowded onto the field below the farm buildings, with John Wesley giving one of his stirring sermons! His visit led a religious revival in the area, many of our chapels owe their existence to him. Wealthy local people gave land and money for building churches outside Halifax, known as Free Chapels, the Wesleyan Chapel (now a private house) in Cragg Vale is one example.

We provide tea and coffee at all meetings. Annual membership starts from our April AGM and is excellent value at only £10 for the year! Meetings, on the third Thursday of every month in St. John's Church, upstairs room, are free for members or £3

Broadhead Clough Spring 2018 update

It was glorious weather for February's workday which fell on Candlemas but the old saying proved true "If Candlemas Day be fair and bright... Winter will have another fight" and it's snowing as I write this! We rebuilt a wall which collapsed under the weight of snow caught on brambles growing over it, and cut reeds in the meadow. This encourages the cows to graze on fresh growth and checks the reeds' spread. Both activities are examples of other sayings - "Prevention is better than cure" or when something is inevitable: "A stitch in time ...saves nine!" With wildlife, if habitat shrinks or fragments, small populations are particularly threatened: numbers decline and eventually could die out altogether. What can we do now to avoid greater impact in the long run?

At Broadhead, a great time to start is before the leaves open. In recent years the tree creeper and spotted flycatcher have declined or not been seen at all in our bird surveys. So, with help from local birdwatchers we've installed a few nest boxes: one can be clearly seen on the standing "dead trunk" by the main entrance. Our resident flocks of tits don't really need them, but they'll give a helping hand for other species that don't compete head to head to "share" the same habitat and establish a territory. It may even attract migrating redstarts to breed here once again. Elsewhere, in March the Trust is commissioning surveys on the Willow Tit, which was widespread including a Calderdale population at Cromwell Bottoms, but now is declining nationally.

Spring workdays are planned on the first Friday of the month at 10a.m. on March 2nd, April 6th, May 4th, and June 1st. We meet at the sign board as you enter the reserve. All tools are provided and gloves if you need them – just bring a drink, and packed lunch if you are staying all day.

FAMILY BUSINESS IN CRAGG VALE

CRAGGIES, a butchery, delicatessen and café perched above Cragg Vale.

Very much a family affair run by Andrea Mellor, son Thomas and daughter Sarah, Craggies began life as Deli Belge in Sowerby Bridge but soon needed more space. A chance conversation in the spring of 2015 resulted, a few months later, in the business moving into the Craggs Country Business Park.

Thomas is a butcher and daughter Sarah is a baker and their trades are an integral part of Craggies success. When asked about the biggest success, Andrea replied 'Tom'. However, she was actually referring to the butchery side of the business, of which Tom is rightly proud. He said "It's all about proper, traditional, butchery. I buy the animals direct from the field, take them to slaughter and butcher them and we make use of every part of the animal. We believe strongly in the welfare of the animals and I only work with farmers I know well. It's important to me to keep everything as local as possible and to make sure the animals have as little stress as possible – because with the least stress we get the best meat".

Andrea is very much a keen supporter of the 'totally locally' campaign. After hearing people talk about having 'gluts' of fruit and vegetables in their gardens at different times of the year, she is thinking about creating local veg boxes involving local growers. "We want to support local producers and keep money within the local area whilst making sure we can give customers what they want. We not only sell our meat in our butcher's shop but we also use it in our pies and sausages and we sell it in the café."

Feedback from customers is important and sometimes helps develop new products. A remark from one Cragg Vale regular regretting he couldn't find the sort of traditional pork pie he remembered from his youth resulted in Sarah making traditional 'stand pies' for Christmas. Sarah is now working towards producing small pork pies, using a traditional recipe, to sell in the shop.

Andrea says Cragg Vale is a really lovely place to have a business from both a business and a social point of view "It's great to be able to have a family business and as well as the wonderful views, we have such nice and supportive local customers".
