On 11th August 1921 a devastating fire destroyed Cragg Hall, home of Cragg Vale's mill-owning Hinchliffe family. To mark the 100-year anniversary, The Cragg Vale History Group is holding a series of events including a special presentation on 12th August; an exhibition in St. John's Church (weekends from 14th to 29th August) illustrating the history of the mansion with a selection of photographs, drawings, and artefacts; a guided walk around the Cragg Hall Grounds (by kind

Experimenting at The Ark



Children often behave like "little scientists" in that they are eager to observe and make "what if" discoveries about their world. There have been many scientific experiments going on at The Ark Nursery recently to coincide with British Science Week, and our budding scientists have loved discovering more about the world around them.

A box of eggs with an incubator arrived and the children were fascinated to watch the chicks peck their way out their eggs. The children enjoyed being responsible for giving food and water to the chicks, and they loved carefully holding their new friends. They also looked at the life cycle of frogs, keeping an eye out at Forest School in case they could see any frogspawn or tadpoles. We made 'homemade' frogspawn from chia seeds and water, so the children could explore texture and find words to describe what they could feel.

Experiments are fun too! The children investigated what happens when you pour water on top of oil, and they were fascinated by the floating oil. The best part was when a vitamin



tablet was added to the mixture - who doesn't love a foaming explosion?

To finish a very busy time, the children discussed what seeds and plants need to grow and grew a bumper crop of cress. Then they made their own butter, spread it on bread and made cress sandwiches - delicious!

Often grumpy, quick with a smile, always generous, with an abundant supply of tall tales and opinions on most things, he made many friends and was a source of warmth and knowledge to all who knew him. Perhaps fittingly, the journey to his final resting place was on the back of a tractor, as he was laid to rest in the Cragg Vale hillsides that he loved so much. News from St. John's Church

After a nice but far from normal return to church services over Christmas, we suspended services as we went back into lockdown, reopening on Palm Sunday. It was good to be back in church but sad that no singing was allowed or socialising afterwards with a cup of coffee! Hopefully, at some point in April, May or June we'll be able to have a little more 'normality'. We broadcast a Zoom service each Sunday at 11am for those who are not ready to return to church and we're still meeting on a Tuesday afternoon for a virtual 'meet and chat' via Zoom. Hopefully, we'll be able to meet physically soon and restart some of our Sanctuary in the Wilderness sessions, we'll share information about dates and times once we know.

Broadhead Clough March 2021 update

I'm writing this on the Spring Equinox - when the hours of daylight lengthen and nature romps away with the promise of more warmth in the sun for plants to grow, frogs to spawn and birds to nest. Hopefully the easing of lockdown will mean people can travel further afield and socialize more even if initially just outdoors. YWT as a whole are anticipating high visitor numbers across all their sites and gearing up to expect more visitors. They are placing volunteer wardens on some of their most popular (yet delicate) reserves to welcome visitors and ensure they get the best out of the visit. It's also a chance to educate them about the important conservation value of the site that will minimize wildlife disturbance. Here at Broadhead Clough we don't get thronged, but the paths are very narrow and get quite muddy after rain. Broadhead Clough is delicate habitat and has SSSI legal environmental protection for its wet woodland and mires. Please read and respect the signage regarding safe distancing, dogs and no cycling. We too have new features to welcome people back. A new bench has been donated as one of the last acts by Mytholmroyd Walkers Action before their amalgamation with Hebden Bridge Walkers Action group. The bench is situated adjacent to the path at a spot where you can see at

least three bird boxes, and come May, enjoy one of the finest views of bluebells in the wood. You can now take a rest and eat your sandwiches in comfort, before tackling the steep climb up onto Erringden Moor. Please remember to take all belongings and any litter home with you. This has been a real community effort with CROWS completing the installation to enhance their Community Rights of Way service. There are also 2 new open-fronted bird boxes at the top of the steps to attract redstarts or flycatchers.

The Trust is hoping to re-start monthly task days in April and welcome new volunteers back soon. This will include work on Brearley Fields Wetlands Nature Reserve in Mytholmroyd, due to start this summer thanks to funding from the European Regional Development Fund. SUSTAINABLE FARMING IN CRAGG VALE

Husband and wife team, Luke and Jayne Barbour, moved to Cragg Vale in 2013. They soon realised that living in beautiful countryside provided an opportunity to have a smallholding and pursue their interests in land management and rearing livestock. Over the last few years, they've become passionate about how to do this in a way that respects the planet: "Look after the Earth so the Earth can look after you" says Luke, Jayne adds "We are becoming increasingly aware of how some practices in conventional agriculture are harming the planet, but we don't believe it's about giving up on animal agriculture, instead improving it and making it work in a way which is respectful and in harmony with the land.

HAVING LESS LIVESTOCK ALLOWS US TO ENSURE THEY ARE AT THEIR OPTIMUM HEALTH

We want to have a positive impact on our land, specifically on the soil, and believe livestock play an

important role. This approach, referred to as regenerative agriculture, will play a huge role in helping address the climate crisis." Luke explains "We have a small flock of

Herdwick sheep, who spend the year grazing our fields. In winter, they eat our hay, which we cut and bale in late summer. By using a minimal amount of carefully sourced supplementary feed, we reduce the carbon footprint of our meat, and have more control over what we put into our animals. It's been a really important journey for us, looking at our current practices and exploring what needs to change. For example, having less livestock allows us to ensure they are at their optimum health and they don't overgraze the land. Using field rotation systems rather than using medication such as wormers on the sheep, helps to improve the insect and microbial life on our land. We've spent a lot of time reclaiming pastures which were overgrown. This year we'll be increasing biodiversity of the plant-life in our fields by over-seeding the pastures with several varieties of grasses, legumes and herbs, which will naturally improve the nutrient and

carbon levels within the soil, stopping the need for fertilisers. It's important the sheep (and chickens) have a symbiotic relationship with the land, trampling grass and seeds, fertilising it with their manure, and in return eating plants that provide them with an incredibly nourishing diet. Sowing these new varieties of grasses, legumes and herbs will also attract pollinators, and increase insect life - something the birds will be very happy about."

IT'S IMPORTANT THE SHEEP HAVE A SYMBIOTIC RELATIONSHIP WITH THE LAND

The issue of whether we should be eating meat or not, in order to address climate change, is a complex and often emotionally charged one. Jayne and Luke say "Many people will be reluctant to give up meat. We feel that meat can be produced in a way that enhances the Earth, and we hope that this approach, based around regenerative agriculture, will show you can produce meat in a way that can be part of the solution to climate change".




