

RUDD LANE: UPDATE

After a long campaign by a local resident, Yorkshire Water will be doing some remedial work on Rudd Lane, mainly on the areas adjacent YW's land. YW said:

"YW will be undertaking works from the car park 379 yards to divert land water away from east down Rudd Lane. Rudd Lane. This will include, cleaning out a drainage ditch at the westerly end at the top of Rudd Lane adjacent to Withens Lane; cleaning away soil from the end of the cross drains where they discharge onto the land to the south side of Rudd Lane and renewing a land drain to catch the land water where it runs through a section of wall on the northern the CVCA website at www. side of Rudd Lane.

The final piece of work will be to rectify a poorly repaired culvert and reinstate the area around this.

In addition to the drainage work, the section of lane which is YW responsibility to maintain will have the surface repaired where damage has occurred. This area extends Once we can see how effective the work has been at diverting land water away from the Lane we can determine if any further works are required."

Discussions are ongoing about road repairs further down the lane. A map showing the details of where the repairs will be is available to see on craggvalecommunity.co.uk

FIND A NEW HOME FOR THE CRAGG SCHOOL MOSAIC

Can a new home be found for the unique wooden mosaic which was created to mark the 100 years anniversary of Cragg School? It was designed by local artist Trevor Cowland in 1987, and put together by the pupils at school at that time. The mosaic has the school as the central feature, with lots of other interesting elements depicting Cragg Vale through the ages. The mosaic is 6.5 metres long and 0.75 metres high, which will require a large length of wall to accommodate it. However, it could be quite easily be cut down into 3 or 4 smaller pieces.

The developers who are currently converting the former school into housing, don't want to see the mosaic destroyed, and they would like it to a new home preferably within the local community.

CARAVAN AND MOTORHOME CLUB

It's lovely to share Cragg with visitors from near and far - but where do they all stay? Well, we've got a highly recommended caravan/ campervan site and a popular rural camp site, so let's meet the people who run them: Linda, from Leeds, runs the Caravan and Motorhome Club site at the bottom of Cragg Vale from March to November. She and her husband live onsite in their caravan managing the site for 5 hours a day [3 weeks on, 1 week off] The site has 42 pitches next to Cragg Brook and has been running since 1972. Remember when it was called Lower Clough Foot? Now it's been renamed after the nearest town: Hebden Bridge to make it easier for visitors to locate!





AARON'S CAMPSITE

Aaron [known as Iggy] owns Aaron's Campsite, at the top of Cragg, on the Sowerby side. He's a born and bred Cragger, his family home was the adjacent Pitts Farm and lots of his family still live in Cragg. The campsite is booked via the Pitchup.com website and encourages families who want a traditional camping experience in beautiful scenery. The site, which has been running for 8 years, is spread out over 4 small fields and includes a caravan and shepherd's hut to rent. You can also rent a fire pit [old tractor wheels!] and wood for a small fee. The little shop sells pop and ice cream. Iggy is hoping to get an alcohol licence and use the rustic barn he built himself, for weddings and celebration parties. He'd love to encourage local bands and musicians to come up and play.

TEAM RAMSDEN — LOCAL RACING SIDECAR TEAM COMPETING ON THE BIG STAGE

Local Cragg-based father and son sidecar team Steve Ramsden (better known as "Rammy") aged 59 and Matty Ramsden, aged 28, have been racing since 2012. So far, their best results have been 2nd in the British Formula 2 sidecar championships and 4th at the Isle of Man TT races. It will soon be the 2022 race season, with some big meetings coming up including Isle of Man on 28th May – 11th June.

There'll also be three race events (dates tbc) in Scarborough organised by Cragg Vale's Andy & Wendy Hayes, via Oliver's Mount Racing Ltd.

Broadhead Clough Spring 2022 update







You may have seen on the news that film crews have been active in Calderdale filming movies and TV dramas. This includes a TV adaptation of "The Gallows Pole" book telling the story of our Cragg Vale Coiners. Although actual filming is being done elsewhere, Yorkshire Wildlife Trust are working with CROWS (the Calderdale Rights of Way Service) to improve the route, which is already gaining popularity due to the "Cragg Vale Coiners Walk." We've seen a few book groups coming to visit who weren't used to map reading or kitted out for the challenges of Pennine landscape. Legally Broadhead Clough is protected as a SSSI due to its wet woodland, and YWT classify the reserve in the "Wildest" category. It's an offence to damage it, which is easily done when the paths are soggy after wet weather and is why bicycles are not allowed to use the footpath. Whilst we aren't intending to change its character we hope to make it easier to follow, and lessen the damage on sections of the path that could get muddy due to increased footfall. We've already replaced the rotting boardwalk at the entrance, but please bear with us if you see work parties creating more boardwalk over drainage channels or the odd step or two.

Also at entrance level we've been clearing more of the self set holly from what is the best bluebell slope. There are now several brash piles across the slope which should make great habitat for blackbirds and wrens. Our volunteer who refurbishes the bird boxes discovered that Storm Barra had blown over one of the "hosting" oak trees. Luckily the box hadn't hit the ground and was undamaged, so could be re-positioned on an adjacent tree. Another unexpected surprise was to see a mature red deer stag with a set of 8

point antlers grazing just outside the reserve. Once only found in Scotland this shows how competition for territory is changing animal behavior.

The Wildlife Trusts are calling for at least 30% of our land and sea to be connected and protected for nature's recovery by 2030. 30% is the bare minimum that nature needs to start recovering but we are far short of this and need your help to turn things around. Perhaps you could sign their petition or make a donation? Making more space for nature to become abundant once again will give our struggling wildlife the chance to recover and also restore beautiful wild places - places that store carbon and help to tackle the climate crisis. Calderdale Council is starting a new project to grow sphagnum moss, funded through the National Lottery Climate Action Fund. Moss collected from RSPB Dove Stone nature reserve is now at Manor Heath Park in Halifax, where volunteers and the local community will help trial different ways of growing it in a nursery setting. When the moss is ready, it will be planted in suitable sites around Calderdale to restore damaged moorland that currently emits carbon.

Task days at Broadhead Clough are the first Friday each month, so March 4th, April 1st, May 6th and also May 27th as the June date would fall on a bank holiday. We start at 10a.m. Check the weather before you set out: will it be waterproofs or sun screen? Also bring a hot drink and food to last for the time you intend to volunteer. You might wish to add hand sanitizer and anti-bac wipes to your bag. All tools are provided, and gloves if required.




