Landscapes for Water Project.

The National Trust and partners, including Yorkshire Water, are working together in their 5-year Landscapes for Water project, to create 350 hectares of woodland in the South Pennines, install thousands of natural flood management interventions and restore peatland.

It is anticipated that the work will reduce flood risk for hundreds of homes, while improving habitats and water quality and capturing carbon.

The agencies are holding public meetings and Knowledge Sharing Events to give people the chance to learn more about plans.

The Knowledge Sharing Event for Cragg Vale is scheduled for Thursday 4th December 2025 from 19:00 – 21:00 at St John's Church, Cragg Vale.

Hosted by the National Trust, it will include

- An overview of the Landscapes for Water Project and the work happening/planned close by.
- A talk from the National Trust's archaeology expert Mark Newman, about the history and findings in the local area.
- An open discussion and Q&A on the history of the local area.

It will be free to attend, so please come along and find out more about this exciting project.







BROADHEAD CLOUGH NOVEMBER 2025 LUDATE



Broadhead Clough is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), in particular for its wet woodland habitat. As the trees grow to maturity, sometimes their canopy is so heavy or the wind blows so strongly that the wet ground causes them to first tilt and then topple over. Those which don't interfere with the path are left as they fall. However each year the Trust carries out a survey of all trees near to the path, which could become hazardous. You may have spotted a small, silver numbered marker on a trunk. This is a sign that this tree is under surveillance, and is being monitored to make sure it does not worsen and become a risk. However, nature is full of surprises, even before the first major storm of the year.

On Sunday 21st September, at 9am we found ourselves blocked in by a large limb that had fallen off the huge oak during



the night, above the main entrance gate. Luckily it had tipped forward, landing on its smaller branches, sort of "head first" and with the heaviest part of the bough off the path. Very quickly with hand saws

we managed to cut a "car shaped" hole to drive through and left the branches on the ground either side. Later, on our return, we began to widen the gap so that it was not such a tight squeeze to negotiate and gradually cut back a clear way through.

Whilst we worked, the small herd of five cows grazing the lower meadows wandered up to the water trough and realised there were acorns, and oak leaves on branches in abundance. You might think cows only eat grass, but our Highlands are hardy, stay out all winter and like people, they often crave a change of diet: chewing branches and leaves. These were in seventh heaven, stripping the fallen branches of bark, leaves and crunching acorns for several hours. They even came back for second helpings the next day too!

During the winter months we'll be continuing to cut back on holly and open up areas of the forest floor to daylight. It's also the time for step repairs and making sure the leaky dams and drains do their jobs: to slow the flow through the reserve whilst keeping the paths passable for people. If you'd like to volunteer at the reserve, we'd love to meet you at the entrance signboard at 10a.m. on Dec 5th, Jan 9th and Feb 6th . Bring food and a hot drink for the time you intend to volunteer. Dress for the weather: lots of layers are best. We usually work until 3pm but leave early if its bad weather. All tools are provided, including thick gloves.
